## **JOIN US FOR COVENANT SUNDAY, APRIL 6**

Who is a member of the First Christian Church of Albany? That is actually a complicated question. It is complicated because our church bylaws are much more legalistic than the long-time practice of the church. Our bylaws state that a person becomes a member of the church in one of two ways — by publicly confessing one's faith and being baptized or by transfer of membership from another church. Those ways of becoming a member are still and always available to everyone who seeks to "join" the church. The starting place for becoming a part of the church in this way is to have a conversation with the pastor and arrange a time to make those declarations.


But, it is also true that for at least 30 years, this congregation has welcomed people into a covenant of fellowship and membership in a much more informal way. When people are drawn to share their lives and faith with this congregation and become regular participants in the full life of the church, happy hearts and open arms receive them unconditionally. By the sharing of their lives they are received and welcomed as members of the church and together we travel the road of faith, mutually supporting and encouraging each other along the way as we grow in our understanding of what it means to be a disciple of Christ. This is membership too.

However and whenever you became a part of the First Christian Church of Albany, we are joining together on Sunday, April 6 to celebrate the covenant of love we share. Everyone will have the opportunity to be counted and claimed as a part of this community of faith. There will also be an opportunity for people to join the church in a formal way – to transfer their membership from another church or to declare their faith in Jesus and seek the waters of baptism on Easter.

To help make this celebration special we are asking individuals and families to take a digital "selfie" picture of themselves and email the picture to <a href="fccalbany@comcast.net">fccalbany@comcast.net</a>. These pictures will be used in worship over the next few weeks and will also be put on a bulletin board to help us become better acquainted with each other. Be creative and have fun with your pictures. Show us the joy you feel at being a part of this church family.

Also, on Sunday, March 30 you'll have the opportunity to pick up a hand print. We'd like you to write your full name on one side of the hand print. On the other side, tell us what makes you happy about being a part of the church. Bring these handprints to worship with you on Covenant Sunday, April 6.

If you won't be able to be in worship on April 6, send or bring your hand print to the church office if you want to be counted and claimed as a part of the First Christian Church of Albany.
