MISSION TRIP UPDATE

Mission trip leaders, participants and their parents will meet at 9 a.m. on Sunday, March 16 in the Youth Commons for a brief informational meeting. There will be a review of final details. If you have questions regarding the trip, bring them to the meeting.

All participants should plan to stay for 10 a.m. worship. The congregation will lift up prayers on behalf of the travelers and offer their blessings for the work and learning trip.

On March 22-30, mission trip participants will travel to Oakland, CA for a week of hands-on service, workshops and learning opportunities in and around Oakland. The Rev. Sandhya Jha, director of the Oakland Peace Center will lead the group in reflecting on each day's experiences and will teach tools for effective peace-building in local communities.

They will have the opportunity to work with these Oakland organizations:

- "Project Darreis" provides food and clothing and works to curb violence. It was founded in memory of Darreis Toyfoya, an 18-year-old who was killed in a random shooting.
- "Urban Releaf" plants trees in disadvantaged neighborhoods to combat poor air quality and other environmental health hazards, and provides education and stewardship opportunities for at-risk youth.
- "Food of God for the People of God" serves hot, nutritious meals to homeless people in outdoor settings each week.



SUNDAY YOUTH GROUPS

Youth groups will meet on Sunday, March 16 at 4:30-5:45 p.m. (grades 6-8) and 6:30-7:45 p.m. (grades 9-12) in the upstairs youth commons. During spring break, the groups will not meet on March 23 and 30. On April 6 and 13, the groups will meet at the usual times and on Saturday, April 19 there will be a day of fellowship. Youth groups will not meet on April 20, Easter Sunday.

During March and April, the groups will hear a new story about the person of Jesus. Through a time of reflective questioning, they will discover deep connections about God, themselves, and the church.
