IN LOVING MEMORY JUNE FLESHMAN



At a memorial service on March 29, we celebrated the vibrant life of June Fleshman. From the time she was born on March 16, 1935 until the day she slipped away, three days shy of her 79th birthday, June's life was a life of praising God with faithful work and joyful song.



Born in Pasadena, CA., June moved with her family to Grants Pass OR. when she was twelve. Her father owned an auto repair shop, her mother taught fourth grade, and June studied piano and accompanied the high school choir. At age seventeen, she went to the University of Oregon, majoring in music education. There she met Keith Fleshman, a pre-med student. They married four years later and together pursued further studies preparing to be missionaries of the United Christian Missionary Society, a predecessor mission body of Global Ministries.

Over a period of forty years June taught music and English, learned three foreign languages, and raised a family of four, often in challenging conditions compounded by three national revolutions. She and Keith served as missionaries in what today is the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ethiopia, and Nepal.

For the children's teen years, June and Keith returned to Lebanon, OR. where Keith practiced orthopedics.

Music, church work and square dancing were June's passions. She was an active member in our church choir and faithfully attended worship. She frequently wrote notes and letters of encouragement to church staff and others.

FLASHPOINT! ON IMMIGRATION

At 9:15 a.m. on Sunday, April 27, we will have a Flashpoint! on immigration. The topic "Exploring Two Concepts - Dreamers or Trespassers" will address the question of what the immigration debate means in Albany, and why it matters to us and our community.

Javier Cervantes and Nancy Greenman will share information, and consider some popular misconceptions around the issues of immigration including the Oregon Dream Act called Tuition Equity, the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals in Oregon (DACA), the impact of deportations on our community, and the Oregon Drivers Card.

Javier Cervantes serves as the Director of Equity, Diversity & Inclusion at Linn-Benton Community College. Nancy is the Prevention Program Coordinator for the Oregon Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force and a member of Albany Peace Seekers.

On April 27, the youth in middle school and high school will have an opportunity to meet with members of the Search Committee during the regular Sunday evening youth group times.


The Congregation
