INSTALLATION SUNDAY - NOVEMBER 23



On Nov. 9, we held a memorial service to celebrate the life of Betty Rea. Betty joined our church on Sept. 23, 1973 and was a tireless volunteer at First Christian Church. She was always busy helping on programs



of the church and serving in whatever ways she could. She was also active in the community, serving Fish, Habitat for Humanity, SMART reading, Albany Peace Seekers, and Friendship Force.

Her faith was not a stagnant, boxed-in thing. It lived, breathed, stretched, grew and gave. At the Wednesday Book Study when the group would get into deep conversations about the theological implications of this or that, Betty always cut to the chase at some point in the

conversation saying, "What really matters, you know, is L-O-V-E. How do we love?" Love was Betty's ultimate truth and greatest motivating force. It was her theology. It was God. She saw God in all things – family and friends, nature, her church and in all the joys, sorrows, challenges and everydayness of life.

Please hold her family in your prayers in these days of grief.

WHILE WE WAIT


All adults and youth are invited to attend "Sundays at Nine" each Sunday from Nov. 23-Dec. 21 and engage in rich conversation and reflective study as we explore Mary Lou Redding's Advent devotional and study book, "While We Wait – Living the Questions of Advent."

This study "will help people who don't want to gloss over their own questions about the Christmas story. It looks at Advent as a journey in which God seeks us at many levels of our understanding and spiritual willingness. It allows for real-life struggles and questions as a legitimate part of Advent's spiritual exploration." (from the back cover)

"While We Wait" is now available for purchase (\$11) in the church office. Some copies are available on loan.

Participants are invited to sign up for the class by calling the church office or signing the clipboard on the table in coffee hour on Sunday mornings.

To prepare for the first class on Nov. 23, participants should read the introduction and first chapter be-



fore class. The in-home reading will take about 15 or 20 minutes, five days of the week. This will be an excellent opportunity to establish or renew a daily prayer and study discipline and explore the journey of Advent in community.

MISSION TRIP TO JUSTLIVING FARM

Our church has a tradition of sending our high schoolers on a learning and service trip during the week of spring break. In 2015 the high school youth (CYF) will be going to the JustLiving Farm outside of Toppenish, WA. They will be looking at this mission experience as a pilgrimage (a journey to a sacred place, a quest) where they will be learning more about themselves and relationships they have with the Creator and the world around them

Each day they will have opportunities to serve the community in and around the farm, as well as opportunities to learn and engage with topics such as human justice, issues of race, culture, ethnicity, dominant culture, privilege, economics, sustainable agriculture, and ecological responsibility.

The trip will be Sunday, March 22 to Friday, March 27.

The estimated cost per person will be \$325 and the participants will be working to raise money to cover at least half of their costs. Registration forms should be completed and returned to the church office by Dec. 7 along with a \$50 deposit. A second \$50 deposit will be due by Feb. 1 and any remainder of the cost which is not covered by fundraising will be due by March 1. Donations to the youth mission trip are always welcome. Checks can be written to FCC with a designation of youth mission trip.
