GENERAL FUND 2015 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The 2015 General Fund budget approved by the congregation at the December Congregational Meeting includes a cost-of-living raise for staff who served throughout 2014, an increase in staff auto allowance and the Pastors' Ministry fund to accommodate the needs of two full-time pastors; an increase to provide more educational resources for children and youth; and a \$660 increase to General Fund outreach. Even with those increases the Budget Committee was able to keep the total budget at \$399,267 which is \$2,574 less than the 2014 budget.

DEEP CHRISTIAN SPIRITUALITY

"WE MAKE THE ROAD BY WALKING" SUNDAYS AT NINE STARTING JAN. 4


All adults and older youth are invited to join a yearlong quest for spiritual formation, reorientation and activation by reading and studying together a new book by Brian McLaren called "We Make the Road by Walking." This book offers all that is needed to explore what a difference an honest, living, growing faith can make in our world today. The book contains 52 weekly readings (a very short chapter) that give an overview of the whole Bible and guide individuals and groups through a year of rich study, interactive learning and personal growth. The weekly readings invite participants to cultivate an honest, intelligent understanding of the Bible and of Christian faith in the 21st century; engage with discussion questions designed to challenge, stimulate and encourage; and re-imagine what it means to live joyfully and responsibly in today's world as agents of God's justice, creativity and peace.

The elders will be using "We Make the Road By Walking" as their study book for the year and other groups are encouraged to join them in using this book as a guide to faith exploration in 2015. Anyone who would be interested in being a part of a group that would meet monthly to share their journey down this

road of spiritual exploration are invited to call Patty Evans or leave a message in the church office. Patty will contact interested people and groups will be formed.

Beginning Sunday, Jan. 4 Patty will be leading a "Make the Road" group that will meet each Sunday at 9 a.m. through Sunday, March 29. On each of these weeks those gathered will share their reflections on their weekly reading. On Sunday, April 12 at 9:00 a.m. everyone who has joined in this yearlong faith exploration journey will be invited to come to a "First Quarter Check Point." This gathering will help participants identify and affirm all they have learned over the first thirteen weeks of the adventure.

Copies of "We Make the Road by Walking" are available in the church office for \$18. All who participate in this quest are invited to begin their reading the first week in January and have the preface, introduction and first chapter read by Sunday, Jan. 4.For more information, see Patty Evans.
