GENERAL FUND DEFICIT GROWS

Our General Fund continues to move steadily into a more serious deficit, now at \$7,351 for the year to date. What does this mean to the work of the church? We tighten our belts programmatically. Resources that would be helpful for education and worship are not purchased. Projects are delayed until the financial picture brightens. We keep doing our best to be Christ's vital and loving church in Albany and the world and trust the resources we truly need to do this work will be present when they are needed most. We persevere and we spread the word that every gift to the General Fund is money applied to ministry and mission.

Most of the time, when the word goes out that the budget is struggling, generous folks will step up with an extra love gift to the General Fund. Other folks will remember how blessed their lives are and will respond by sharing an extra blessing with the church. Other folks will catch up with pledges and intentions made but not fulfilled due to busy schedules and stretched resources. People who hadn't thought they had anything to give experience the joy of placing a regular gift in the offering plate. Together, we make up the difference and the work of the risen Body of Christ continues to proclaim, "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!"

TRANSITION TEAM NARROWS INTERIM PASTOR CANDIDATE FIELD

Regional Minister Cathy Myers Wirt presented four interim pastor candidate options to the FCC Transition Team on April 6. The team narrowed the field to two options.

A representative from the Transition Team attended the April 13 church board meeting to present the interim pastor job description, salary and benefits, associate pastor job descrip-



tion for the interim period, and the updated congregational profile.

At its next meeting on Saturday, April 18, Cathy and the team will develop reference questions for calls to be made in the next week. The team hopes to make an offer soon after the calls are completed.

Meet and Greet Cathy Myers Wirt

On Sunday, April 19, at our "Sundays at Nine" gathering, everyone is invited to meet and greet our Regional Pastor, the Rev. Dr. Cathy Myers Wirt.

Cathy will be present to share about the exciting and important ministries of our regional church which encompasses Disciple congregations in Oregon and Southwest Idaho. She will share her insights and expertise on the congregation's work of hiring an interim pastor, discerning future staffing possibilities and the search for a permanent pastor to join Douglass Anne Cartwright in pastoral leadership. This will be an excellent opportunity to learn more about the congregation and to join in shaping a vision for ministry and mission that extends beyond transition into the future.

April 26 at 9 a.m. Catch Up with the Transition Team

On Sunday, April 26, "Sundays at Nine" will include an introduction to the work of the Transition Team and an opportunity to hear what they have been working on recently. Come and hear about the Interim Pastor search and the job description developed for this position. Also the Congregational Profile, which guides the work of both the Transition Team and the future Search Committee, will be available to read. There will be plenty of time to ask questions, offer ideas and share concerns. This is an excellent opportunity to become well-informed.

WHAT COMES NEXT?

Douglass Anne and I had lunch recently with the pastors at Eugene FCC. Our congregations have been paired as "Partner Churches" as a part of the regions's visioning project. So we visited and talked about how we might intersect in mission. As we visited Dan asked me, "So when does it begin?" I wasn't sure what he was talking about. "When does WHAT begin?" I asked. "Your retirement!"

Crazy as it seems, I was stunned. When does it begin? My thoughts on retirement have been about what is ending and the "lasts" I am observing - my last Lent with you, last Good Friday, last Easter, with a last Sunday looming. When someone asks me about future plans, I don't have much of an answer because I am focused on ending not on beginning.

I thanked Dan for his question because I needed a paradigm shift! Lasts might be good for the memory bank but "what is beginning" is embedded with hope, excitement, new life and affirms that God is still working in what happens next.

I'm looking forward to leading spiritual growth retreats and workshops through Sacred Path Ministry. I plan to finally get out my cello, and join a string ensemble. I want to experiment with different art mediums. I look forward to traveling. I want to widen my circle of friendships and explore what God is calling me to do in ministry in the community and world. Wow – sounds like I'm going to be busy!

So what comes next for you? All that we have done together over these last 11 1/2 years has been good. But what has been is not as important as what comes next! These are challenging times and cultural shifts are calling the church to explore new horizons of faithfulness and out-reaching love.

Douglass Anne is well-trained and well-equipped to provide pastoral leadership for such a time as this. Soon she will have a new partner in ministry and together this pastoral team, great support staff and you will continue to grow and respond in faithfulness to living the Good News of Jesus Christ in this community and world. What comes next is embedded with hope, excitement, new life and affirms that God is still and always working in what happens next.
