2. Become nervous at every repeat sign wondering whether to take the repeat this time or not.

3. If you sing a wrong note, give a nasty look to the person next to you.

4. Take your time turning pages.

5. If everyone gets lost except you, follow those who get lost.

6. If a passage is difficult, slow down. If it's easy, speed up. Everything will work itself out in the end.

7. When everyone else has finished singing, you should not sing any notes you have left over.

8. A wrong note sung timidly is a wrong note. A wrong note sung with authority is a musical interpretation.

9. God grants extra blessings for harassing the choir director.

10. If on Sunday morning you wonder if we actually practiced the piece we are singing, don't worry, everyone else is thinking the same thing.
