If you would be interested in teaching, helping, or serving on a children's worship team, please contact Douglass Anne as soon as possible.



DEEP CHRISTIAN SPIRITUALITY

SUNDAYS AT NINE: TALKING "TRANSITIONS"

We are in transition here at FCC Albany as we welcome our interim pastor, Eric, and look towards conversations about our future as a church. All transitions, whether in our personal lives or in the church, begin with an ending. Endings bring out a wide variety of emotions from us, including feelings that 'nothing will ever be as good as it was.' Yet, how we recognize endings often determines how our new beginnings will take shape.

The second step in transition is called the "neutral zone," which can often feel like an unproductive timeout where we feel disconnected from each other. This time, however challenging it may be to wait and reflect, is crucially important for us to reorient ourselves towards the future.

Beginning Sunday, Sept. 20 at 9 a.m. in the Cornerstone Room, Beth Hogeland will lead us in conversation about our endings and neutral zone at FCC Albany. Our discussion will be based on the book, <u>Transitions</u>, by William Bridges, but you do not need to read the book to join in.


