

ENLIGHTEN FCC

FCC APPLIED FOR A GRANT FOR SOLAR PANELS FOR THE CHURCH THROUGH PACIFIC POWER'S BLUE SKY BLOCK PROGRAM, WHICH HELPS ADVANCE THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW NON-RESIDENTIAL RENEWABLE ENERGY PROJECTS. IF SUCCESSFUL, FCC WILL JOIN OTHER CONGREGATIONS ACROSS THE COUNTRY THAT ARE ENGAGING THEIR MEMBERS IN CREATION-CARE BY REDUCING THE CONGREGATION'S GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS IN ORDER TO SUPPORT A CLEAN AND HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT FOR THE FUTURE. THIS PROJECT SUPPORTS THE CHURCH'S "PASSION FOR JUSTICE" MISSION.

The church consumes about 56,000 kilowatt hours (kwh) a year at a cost of approximately \$9,000 a year. The south-facing roof is in good condition and can accommodate a 33 kW system that would generate approximately 39,700 kwh a year through a net-metered system. The system would reduce our electricity use and cost by about 70 percent at current usage rates (at least \$6,000 a year for more than 20 years). As the church replaces compact fluorescent and incandescent bulbs with LEDs, the savings will be greater.

The panels would be located on the south-facing gable roof, towards 5th Avenue.



Peter Greenberg of Energy Wise provided a below-market rate for the church at \$2 a kWh, the total system will cost \$66,000. A display panel and tasteful signage are estimated at \$1,000. The church applied for a grant for \$57,000 to cover most of the cost of the solar system, leaving \$10,000 for a required match.

You can support this green project by participating in the "Enlighten" campaign:

- 1) "Buy" one or more "T-8" LED light bulbs (\$10 each);
- 2) "Buy" a month of electricity from the last year (ranging from \$564 to \$1,378);
- 3) Sign up for the Blue Sky program at home; and
- 4) Volunteer to help replace bulbs with LEDs.

FCC will be notified around September 1, 2016, of award decisions. At this time, the church can make a final decision whether to accept the grant and grant conditions (panel display, sign, and Blue Sky participation). If we don't get the grant, funds raised will be used to replace all of the bulbs, light fixtures and other equipment as necessary with more efficient options to begin reducing energy consumption. Due to the steep pitch of the roof and the contractor's schedule, the solar panels will be installed the first dry days in mid November or early spring of 2017.

The Pastoral Search Committee met twice in July. On July 14 we received job descriptions for Lead Pastor and Associate Pastor, and the updated Congregational Profile, both of which are shared with applicants. She shared what the Search Committee process would be from now to September, along with questions and articles to equip us.

On July 22 we met to review our progress toward preparation. We will meet twice in August and receive candidate packets mid-month. After the committee's discernment, interviews (via Skype) will follow the reference screenings.

This is a very exciting time to be a part of FCC Albany.
